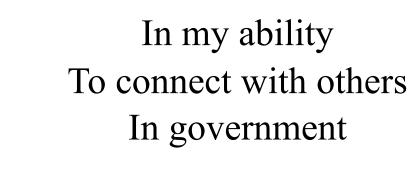






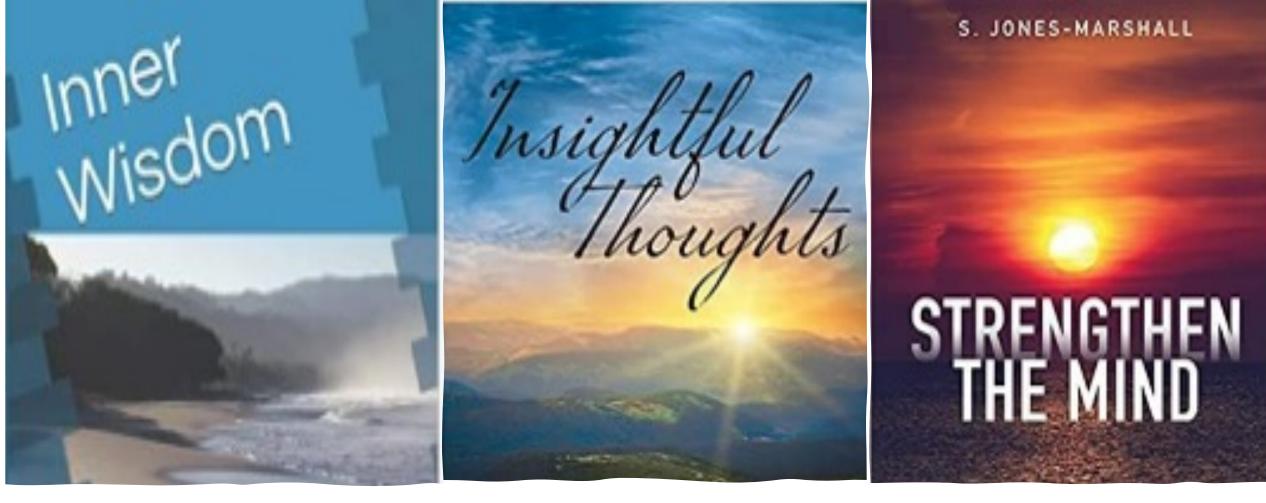

to do to achieve their goals.

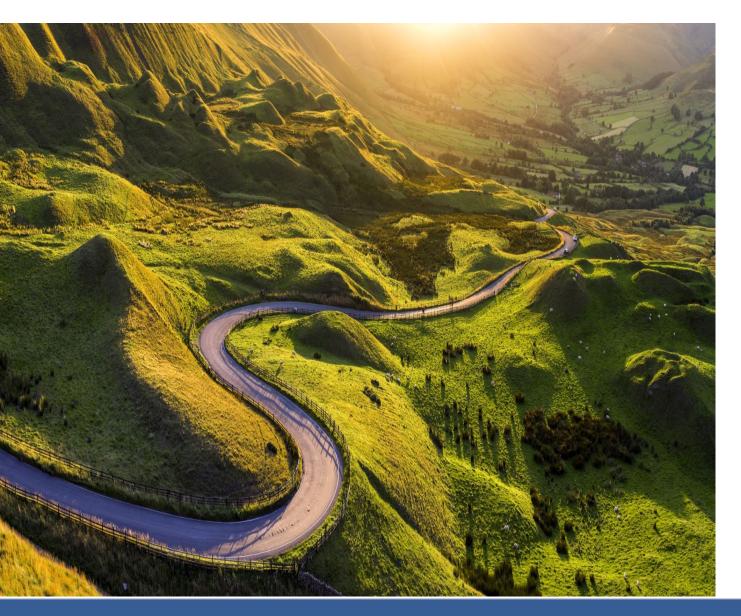

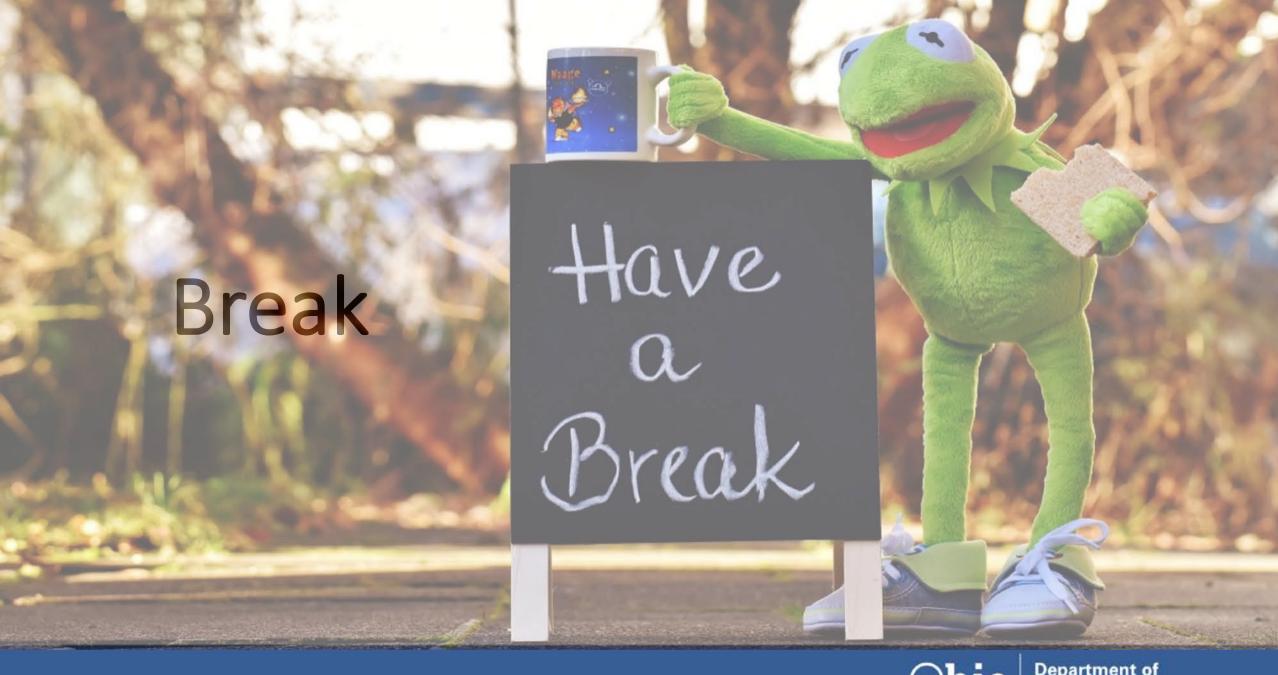
